Theme of the week: St George's Day

Action:

To educate young people on St George's Day. St George is England's patron saint. The anniversary of his death, which is on April 23, is seen as England's national day. According to legend, he was a soldier in the Roman Army who killed a dragon and saved a princess.



Exercise 1 – Group discussions - Values of England (Democracy, Individual Liberty, Rule of Law, Mutual Respect)

In groups: what do British values mean? Encourage a debate within your household, so that young people can express their views. Listen with respect to the opinions of others.

Exercise 2 (Arts & Crafts) - St George's Day Flag

- Card
- White PVA glue
- White and red tissue paper

Instructions:

Draw a cross on the card. Paint the card with a coat of glue. Rip up the tissue paper into small squares and scrunch into balls. Stick the red tissue paper onto the cross. Fill the rest of the card with the white. Display your flag proudly for St George's Day and other patriotic occasions!
